Introduction

Scripture Reading: Philippians 1:3-11

- 1. In verse 7 of our reading, we see into Paul's heart:
 - A. A genuine love of the gospel and willing to suffer to uphold it.
 - B. A Love of the brethren who share this commitment!
- 2. This is the spirit of every true Bible Christian.

Paul's Unselfish Commitment to Serve God

- 1. Chapter 1 reveals Paul's unselfish commitment to serve God, save the lost, and to edify the saved:
 - A. Verses 3-8 Thankful to God and the brethren for the privilege to preach the gospel of Christ.
 - 1) He showed a heart filled with Prayer and Thanksgiving.
 - a. "Pray without ceasing"1 Thessalonians 5:17
 - 2) Did he count his blessings or complaints?
 - a. He was always striving to grow nearer to the heart of God.

- 3) Fellowship: he strove to have Spiritual unity, a relationship with Christ and others, and active participation in the gospel.
 - a. Verses 5, 7 "Fellowship in the gospel," "partakers of my grace."
 - b. With the Father, the Son, and all the Saints.

1 John 1:3 what we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ.

- B. Verses 9-11 A concern for Spiritual growth and maturity of the Brethren.
 - 1) To grow in Love, Knowledge, and Judgment.
 - a. The context of true growth: LOVE-the unselfish spirit of serving God and man.
 - b. Striving to seek more knowledge in love.
 - c. Our judgment and discernment grows from having love and knowledge.
 - 1. One learns facts, then concepts and then practical day to day application.

- 2) He approve the things that are excellent, Distinguishing the things that differ.
 - a. That which is right and wrong, and good and evil.2 Timothy 2:15
 - b. Learning the matters of revealed faith and matters of personal conscience.
- 3) The result of maturity it bears fruit of righteousness.
 - a. All fruit of the Spirit, all the Christian characteristics, result in a life that is a blessing to all men.
 - b. A lack discernment: fruit will be sin, apostasy, friction, disruption.
- C. Verses 12-18 A focus on the spreading of the gospel above his own personal trials.
 - 1. A Spirit of Joy Overshadows any personal suffering.
 - 2. Verses 12-14 Trials Caused by Unbelievers.
 - a. The result: Paul preaching in bonds while other men were preaching not in bonds.

- 3. Verses 15-18 Trials When Betrayed by Brethren.
 - a. A spirit of competition: criticizing Paul to promote themselves.
 - b. As far as Paul was concerned there was NO competition, no bitterness, no retaliation.
 - 1. The result: The gospel being spread by men of right and wrong spirits.
 - 2. Paul rejoiced! Why? How? His heart was filled with an unselfish spirit, He defended the gospel not self!
- D. Verses 19-26 He always sought to magnify Christ in Life and in death.
 - 1) One magnifies Christ by serving Him.
 - a. How? As one lives to teach, strengthen, and encourage the brethren.
 - b. Also by serving our brethren.
 - 2) One magnifies Christ if one dies in faithful service to Him.
 - a. A Great reward that has been greatly desired!
 - 1. "To die is gain" to be with Christ is far better.

- 3) Christ is magnified by a Life of unselfish service.
 - a. Selfish life:
 - 1. Seek to be served, immediate gratification, to use, manipulate, or deceive others.
 - b. Unselfish life:
 - 1. Yield, delay our wishes, our preferences, and our advantages to serve others.
- E. Verses 27-30 He urged the saints to stand fast, to be united!
 - 1. To live godly lives, demonstrate a firm faith, being united in our efforts to spread and defend the Gospel.
 - 2. To fight together for the truth.
 - a. We should fight Satan, not each other.
 - b. Defend the gospel, oppose false doctrine.
- 2. Do not be discouraged by persecution.
 - A. If we are being persecuted then we must be striving to live godly.
 - 2 Timothy 3:12
 - 1. Christ suffered.
 - 2. Paul suffered.
 - 3. The Saints at Philippi suffered.
 - 4. Saints today suffer.
 - 5. Be steadfast in our suffering: It points to our final victory!

Conclusion

- 1. Let God fill and mold your heart:
 - A. Be thankful to serve God and the Brethren.
 - B. Make it your aim to be concerned for Spiritual growth.
 - C. Focus on the spreading of the Gospel to others.
 - D. Magnify Christ in life and in death!
 - E. Stand fast and stand united (1 Corinthians 15:58)
